Vulnerable witness

- A person who is at increased risk of psychological harm from appearing before the court
- A person who experiences psychological, socioemotional or physical difficulties affecting their ability to appear

Causes of vulnerability:

- person-related factors
- factors associated with the nature of the criminal act
- factors based on unique circumstances

Factors which influence vulnerable witnesses

- trauma
- collective memory
- culture of shame
- pressure and intimidation

Motivation to testify

- need for justice
- desire to alleviate own suffering
- aspiration to regain self-esteem and control over their lives
- ethical responsibility towards those who did not survive
- desire to record the true version of events
- desire to shield others from similar experiences

Vulnerable witness in criminal proceedings

- Well-being
- Safeguarding against re-traumatization
- Physical security

Protection mechanism

- Do no harm!
- Procedural instruments
 - VWS (support, familiarisation)
 - interviewing v. interrogation (PEACE questioning model)
 - non-confrontational hearing
 - evidentiary presumptions

Vulnerable witnesses – perspective from Ukraine

- VWS at the Office of Prosecutor General
- Model Courts' Initiative
 - Trainings and information campaign
 - Model solutions
 - Volunteers' service
 - Inter-institutional cooperation
